

SPECIAL REQUESTS

- Remember you must pay a \$10 participation fee to participate in the newspaper IAA competition.
- Mail all your newspaper IAA entries in one package. Do not send each in a separate mailing.
- Use care in mounting entries. Mount using paper only. Do not spend extra money on special mount board. Don't paper clip or staple entries. Tape or glue carefully.
- You may want to send all entries certified mail since some problems have been experienced in receiving entries through the postal system. If you wish to use UPS, mail entries to the UIL at 1701 Manor Road, Austin, TX 78722.
- Decisions of the judges are final. Please accept them with good sportsmanship. We strive to secure the finest judges possible and we have confidence in their abilities. To compare your entry against the winners, visit the IAA displays the Saturday of the April convention.

Also, the "Tops in Texas" individual achievement awards will be published and mailed to ILPC members next fall.

CONTEST RULES

1. Staffs may submit two entries in each category.
2. All entries must be the original work of the student staff member and must have been published in the entrant's school newspaper **during the calendar year February 2, 2010 through February 1, 2011**. In the photo categories, the student must have taken the picture.
3. On the front of the mounting sheet at the top of the page, type or print the contest category. For example, "News Writing." On the back of the entry, complete the short form for the needed information. This form can be pasted to the back of entry mounting sheets.
4. Each entry must be cut from the publication and mounted on an 8-1/2 x 11-inch sheet of paper. Exception: Photo story, page design categories and in-depth news/feature package need not be mounted. The entry form should be taped or pasted to the back side of the entry. Do not spend time and money on expensive poster board. Use 8-1/2 x 11-inch paper.
5. All of the newspaper awards will be judged in eight divisions: JH/MS, A, 2A, 3A, 4A-1, 4A-2, 5A-1 and 5A-2.
6. In each division, first, second and third place winners will be awarded gold, silver and bronze medals, respectively. In some cases, honorable mention ribbons will also be presented. Results will be announced and medals presented at the annual ILPC convention in Austin. Unclaimed medals will be mailed after the convention.
7. In photographic categories, submit the reproduction published in the student publication and the photographic print (or a high quality laser print-out if scanned) if possible. Include the caption with the entry. PLEASE NOTE: Photos submitted in the yearbook IAA competition may not be entered in the newspaper competition. All entries become the property of ILPC/UIL, may be published and distributed, and cannot be returned.
8. In categories 10-12, a single column is one entry. Do not send all the samples of a given column.
9. Only one medal will be presented per entry per category. If two persons combine for a category, ILPC will award one medal. Schools may purchase additional medals.
10. All entries must be packaged and clearly labeled "Newspaper IAA Entries" and mailed to the ILPC office.

■ **YOU CAN SUBMIT UP TO TWO ENTRIES IN CATEGORIES #1 THROUGH #26.**

1. NEWS WRITING. An article which presents the latest or most current information on new or already-published information, past events or future events.
 2. NEWS FEATURE. An article which presents an angle on a past, present or future news event. Strong news content with a feature angle.
 3. EDITORIAL WRITING. An editorial written as statement of staff.
 4. SPORTS ACTION STORY. Either coverage of past or present game(s) or a season summary. Play-by-play rehashes should be avoided.
 5. SPORTS FEATURE STORY. Feature story or personality profile of a sports-related person, issue or event.
 6. FEATURE WRITING. Personality profiles or human-interest general features. Emphasis should be rich in detail and liberal use of quotes.
 7. ENTERTAINMENT REVIEW. Movie, music, television, theatre or book reviews.
 8. ENTERTAINMENT FEATURE. A feature story about a person or persons in the movie, music, television, theatre, restaurant or publishing business. This is a feature — not a review.
 9. PHOTO STORY. The full page: Headlines, copy, photos and captions. The entry will be judged on quality of photography, copy and graphics. Page does not have to have copy other than captions and headline.
 10. PERSONAL COLUMN. A personal column or a humorous column. First person experience.
 11. PERSONAL OPINION COLUMN. Personal opinion, issue-oriented, on a news/feature story
 12. SPORTS COLUMN. Personal opinion sports writing.
 13. IN-DEPTH NEWS/FEATURE STORY. This category is for the single, in-depth story rather than the in-depth package. Emphasis on depth, multiple-sources, local angles.
 14. IN-DEPTH NEWS/FEATURE PACKAGE. This category is for the multiple story coverage of a single issue. Again, emphasis on depth, multiple-sources, local angles. This can be a package from one issue or a series in several issues. Design/photography/art are also considered in this category.
 15. STUDENT ART. Original artwork, done by hand (not computer), used in lieu of photographs with intent to enhance any news/feature/sports article. **Include article that goes with the art.**
 16. COMPUTER ART. Artwork generated on computer that is used in lieu of photographs with intent to enhance any news/feature/sports article. Artwork must be created by students using an art program such as Photoshop, Illustrator, Freehand or something similar. Artwork can be manipulated photos. **Include article that goes with the art.**
 17. CARTOON. Artwork and caption intended to make an editorial statement. **Include editorial that goes with the art, if there is one.**
 18. PAGE ONE DESIGN. Enter complete front page.
 19. SPORTS PAGE/SPREAD DESIGN. Enter complete page or double page spread on one topic.
 20. FEATURE/ENTERTAINMENT PAGE DESIGN. Enter complete page (one page only, not multiple pages).
 21. DOUBLE-TRUCK DESIGN. Enter complete two-page spread.
- **PHOTOGRAPHY:** Send original print and reproduction from paper with caption. If negative is scanned or shot with a digital camera, send reproduction from paper with caption plus a high-quality laser print-out.
22. GENERAL NEWS PHOTOGRAPH. Emphasis on action. Well-cropped, in-focus. No posed shots or portraits.
 23. FEATURE PHOTOGRAPH. Human interest photo with emphasis on people in their environment.
 24. SPORTS ACTION PHOTOGRAPH. Action dominates. Well-cropped, in-focus with excellent tonal quality. Photo should have a central theme with unessential elements deleted.
 25. SPORTS FEATURE PHOTOGRAPH. Well-cropped, in-focus with excellent tonal quality. Photo should have a central theme with unessential elements deleted.
 26. PORTRAIT. A posed photograph of one or more people, either in a studio setting or in an environment that explains something about the person. The entry should capture a sense of who the people are in the photograph.
- **SUBMIT ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CATEGORY FOR THE FOLLOWING:**
27. CAPTIONS — Entry must include five (5) captions with photos. Captions/photos can be from any section of the newspaper. Can be multiple authors.
 28. HEADLINES — Entry must include five (5) headlines with stories. Headlines/story can be from any section of the newspaper. Can be multiple authors.
